Queen's Park FC Scottish Cup winners 1873-74

The Scottish Football Association was founded at a meeting held in Dewar's Temperance Hotel on Bridge Street, Glasgow on the 13 March 1873. The Scotish Challenge Cup was also established. Seven clubs attended the meeting; Chydesdale, Dumbreck, Eastern, Granville, Queen's Park, 3rd Lanark RV and Vale of Leven. Although Kilmarnock didn't attend they had sent a letter stating their willingness to join.

At this time, all these clubs initially contributed \pounds_1 each towards the cost of the purchasing a trophy and by the time the cup was produced by George Edward \pounds Sons, the sum of \pounds_1 12s had been raised as follows; Clydesdale and Queens Park (\pounds_5 each), Western (\pounds_4), 3rd Lanark RV and Alexandria Athletic (\pounds_3 each), Dumbreck and Granville (2 guineas each), Dumbarton (\pounds_1 10s), Rovers (\pounds_1 5s), Kilmarnock, Renton, Callander, Blythswood, Eastern and Vale of Leven (all \pounds_1). This was raised to \pounds_4 1 12s through further donations. With the finished trophy and badges costing \pounds_5 6 12s the SFA were allowed extra time to raise the balance.
